

Privacy Notice for Deloitte Five Million Futures (5MF) UK Education Programme Research Study

1 Why are we collecting this data?

The National Foundation for Educational Research (NFER) is undertaking research into Deloitte's Five Million Futures (5MF) UK education programme. The research will take place between May and July 2022.

The research will explore schools' usage of the laptops donated by Deloitte during the pandemic, as well as include a small number of in-depth school case studies.

As data controller, Deloitte decides what data will be collected and how it will be processed. As a data processor, NFER follows Deloitte's instruction about how data should be handled.

2 What is the legal basis for processing activities?

The research is being undertaken as part of Deloitte's public research function and therefore its legal basis for processing personal data is covered by:

• Article 6 (f) Legitimate interests: the processing is necessary for your legitimate interests or the legitimate interests of a third party, unless there is a good reason to protect the individual's personal data which overrides those legitimate interests.

A legitimate interest assessment has been undertaken. It demonstrates that the research is within Deloitte's interests. In addition, it has wider social benefit and will lead to increased understanding of, and improvements in, Deloitte's 5MF education programme. The research cannot be done without processing personal data but processing does not override the data subject's interests.

3 How will personal data be obtained?

Deloitte will provide NFER with the names and contact details of school leads and other key staff within schools that are engaging with the 5MF education programme. It will also provide NFER with the names of Deloitte volunteers involved with the selected case-study schools. NFER will then collect additional information directly from evaluation participants as detailed below.

School staff

• via telephone/virtual interviews with Deloitte school leads and/or other key staff involved with the donated laptops scheme



Students

 via telephone/virtual interviews or focus groups with students in case-study schools who have benefitted from involvement in Deloitte's programme

Deloitte volunteers

• via telephone/virtual interviews with volunteers working with case-study schools.

4 What personal data is being collected by this project?

Personal data collected by this project is described below:

School staff

- the names of staff responsible for coordinating the Deloitte education activities or the usage of laptops in their schools and other contact information, including name of school, address, email address, telephone number and role
- the views and experiences of staff regarding the effectiveness and impacts of the laptop scheme and, in case-study schools, the Deloitte 5MF education programme more broadly

Students

- the names and year groups of students who have been involved in the Deloitte education programme
- the views and experiences of students and perceptions of the benefits they have gained

Deloitte volunteers

- the names and roles of Deloitte volunteers
- information on activities that have been delivered to case-study schools and views on effectiveness and impacts for schools, staff and students.

5 Who will personal data be shared with?

Data will be shared between Deloitte and NFER but no other parties.

Participation in all research activities is entirely voluntary. Interviewees will be fully briefed on the purposes of the study and how the information they provide will be used before consenting to take part. Contact details will only be used for the purposes of the evaluation.

NFER will produce a report for Deloitte for their internal use which will not be available to the general public. Deloitte may externally publish selected and anonymised findings from this report in autumn 2022. No individual or organisation will be identifiable in NFER's internal report and Deloitte's outputs, unless permission has explicitly been given by the data subject.



Depending on how evaluation data is collected, it may be necessary to share contact details with a third party providing video conferencing facilities, for example Zoom or Microsoft Teams.

Is personal data being transferred to a third country? 6

Information about you in our possession may be transferred to other countries (which may include countries outside the European Economic Area ("EEA")), such as jurisdictions where our third parties conduct their activities, for example Zoom.

When we, or our permitted third parties, transfer your information outside the EEA, we or they will impose contractual obligations on the recipients of that data to protect your information to the standard required in the EEA.

7 How long will personal data be retained?

NFER will delete any personal data within one year of the research study. At the latest this will be August 2023.

Can I stop my personal data being used? 8
